One month from today and the football season at the Head of the Lakes will be in full swing. Head of the Lakes interscholastic conference teams will prepare for their initial contests.

With the king of all sports knocking at our door one can do nothing to put off the temptation of peering into the future and see what is in store for followers of the high school sport.

Duluth Central high school will have a new coach. Ray Perkins is his name. Perkins comes here at a salary of \$2,500 for the season. When he accepted the Duluth offer he was principal and athletic director of the Carrollton (Mo.) high school. He also is a former star athlete of the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic association. He will take up his new duties when school starts next month.

Said To Be Good.

Perkins got his early training under Dr. Forrest C. Allen, now athletic director of Kansas university. At the time that Dr. Allen was coach of athletics at the Central State Teachers' college at Warrensburg and turned out winners so consistently that other members of the M. I. A. A. trumped up charges and had his school removed so that they would have a better chance at the various buntings. Perkins was a backfield man on several of the winning teams that Allen put out. He was regarded as one of the best backfield men in the conference. He took charge of athletics at Carrollton when sports were practically unknown there and in two years has made a great record there. He has supplemented his experience of the past with the training this summer under Coach Zuppke of Illinois and is now fitted for the job assigned to him in Duluth. Perkins is the first paid coach Duluth Central has had in a number of years.

Perkins will have six letter men back in the lineup of the red and white machine. Marshall, star full-back, is captain. There will be a number of recruits who look promising.

Cathedral High School.

Cathedral high school is looked up as a possible winner of the conference championship this year. Dave Cameron, who was selected as all-conference halfback, is captain. With the exception of three or four men the Cathedral team will be the same as it was last season.

Brother Mathews has been south during the last few weeks looking for a coach. Differences in salary has forced Coach Doonin to resign. There is a possibility of Chuck Dayling, former Gopher star, taking up the duties as coach. This job carries a salary of \$1,000 with it.

Denfeld High Prospects.

Bill Monat will be retained as coach at Denfeld this year. Monat has turned out some great teams in the West Duluth school. He has little material to work with. This year he will have a number of veterans back in the field. "Chuck" Larson is captain of the team this year.

Superior High School.

For years the Superior high school has been considered the most-feared school in the conference. Coach L. I. Tubbs always managed to turn out a winning team, no matter what material he had. Tubbs has resigned and taken a post at Superior normal. F. F. Carson of Minneapolis has been hired as coach for the purple and white. Carson is considered a good man. He has coached winning teams in Minneapolis as well as Salem, Ore., and Grand Rapids, Minn. He is 32 years old and married. He received his athletic experience at Macalester college.

Carson will have a number of linemen back in the game but will have to develop a new backfield. Bug Hugener is captain of the team.

Superior Normal Has Tubbs.

Head of the Lakes fans are anxiously waiting to see what Coach Tubbs will do at Superior normal this year. He has one grand collection of athletes from both Duluth and Superior high schools. In his collection will be found such men as Ted Whearett, Morris Haron, Nelson, Watts, Anderson, Gronseth and other famous Twin Ports high school athletes. Tubbs should turn out state champions at Superior this year.

Nelson-Dewey a Puzzle.

In the East End of Superior there is the Nelson-Dewey high school. Year after year this game little school turned out teams only to be smothered by all other conference elevens. This year there might be a different story. The little institution of East End will try and show that it can win games once in a while. The coaching problem has as yet to be solved.
