

Virginia Girl Is Bride at Mill City Society Wedding

The following item from the Minneapolis Tribune will be of interest to the many Virginia friends of Miss Harriet Schanedling, who was for many years a resident of that city. She grew up there and is a graduate of the Virginia high school:

"Before an improvised altar of palms, ferns and tall cathedral candles, the wedding of Miss Harriet Schanedling, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Julius Schanedling of Virginia, Minn., and Nathan Coddon, son of of Samuel Coddon of St. Paul, was solemnized Tuesday evening, in the Gold room of the Madison hotel. One hundred and twenty-five friends and relatives of the bride and bridegroom witnessed the ceremony read by Rabbi I. Meyerowitz of St. Paul, assisted by Rabbi J. E. Hurwitz and Rev. Eli Kriebelberg.

"Miss Esther Woolpy played the bridal chorus from 'Lohengrin' as the processional. Before the bridal party entered August Loring sang 'Because,' and Cadman's 'At Dawning.'

"The Misses Ruth Lieberman, Mildred Coddon and Ethel Shrader were the bridesmaids, while Mrs. H. S. Koff acted as matron of honor. The bridesmaids wore gowns of pink, apricot and blue, fashioned with chiffon overdresses and had corsage bouquets of sweet peas. Mrs. Koff was gowned in gray satin with the bodice of a deeper shade of gray elaborated with spangles. Little Phyllis Schanedling, sister of the bride, was the flower girl, and Leonard Lieberman, nephew of the bridegroom, carried the ring in a lily. Messrs.
