

Diver Searches Bay Waters for Levant Death Gun

A search for the gun with which Edward Levant, Brainerd merchant, was shot April 11 at the foot of Garfield avenue, was made in the waters there yesterday by Capt. Horace I. Thompson, well-known diver. It is presumed that Captain Thompson was employed by insurance companies to make an effort to recover the gun. He refused to state whether or not he was successful in his attempt. Levant was insured for sum aggregating \$15,000. A short time ago the police used an electric magnet in an effort to recover the gun believed to be in the waters where Levant was found dying. While Superior and Duluth police harbor the theory that Levant ended his own life, relatives contend he was murdered.
