**R**aymond William Busch of Barrington Hills A Mass of Christian Burial for Raymond W. Busch, 80, a former longtime resident of Mount Prospect, will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Monday, May 25, at St. Anne Church, 120 Ela St. (at the corner of Franklin St.), Barrington, where there will be visitation from 9 a.m. until the time of the Mass. Burial will be private in Ridgewood Cemetery, Des Plaines. Visitation will also be from 2 to 7 p.m. Sunday, May 24, at the Davenport Family Funeral Home, 149 W. Main St. (Lake-Cook Road), Barrington. Mr. Busch was a graduate of Carlton College in Northfield, Minn. and the University of Chicago Law School, where he was a member of Psi Upsilon Fraternity and an active member of their alumni group. He went on to serve as associate legal counsel of the University of Chicago for 42 years. He was a proud veteran of the Korean War. Mr. Busch was an election judge for Algonquin Township, on the legal committee for the Village of Barrington Hills, a trustee for the Baptist Theological Seminary, and a retired member of the State of Illinois and the U.S. Supreme Court bars. He had a passion for animal welfare and was an active member of the Hilton Head Humane Society. He was an extensive world traveler and an amateur photographer. Most importantly, he was a loving husband, father, grandfather and philanthropist, who with his wife, recently donated land for a wildlife nature preserve to the Barrington Hills Conservation Trust. Survivors include his wife, Jenese (nee Mondschine); children, Nancy Rae (Franco) Laterza of Barrington Hills, Debby Lee (Gary) Cooper of Cincinnati and Susan Dawn (Michael) Marsico of Atlanta; grandchildren, Frankie, Jackson, Danielle, Joseph, Gregory, Melisa, Mathew and Amanda; and nieces and nephew, Pamela R. Busch, Christine L. Busch and Carl F. Busch III. He was preceded in death by his daughter, Darcy Blair Lukemeyer; parents, Carl and Frieda Busch; and brother, Carl F.
