## Mrs. Davis, Community Leader Dies

Mrs. Harry W. Davis, 74, of 115 17th Ave. E., long-time leader in Duluth community projects, died Monday in a Duluth hospital. Born in St. Paul, she lived in Duluth for about 50 years. She was the widow of Harry W. Davis, prominent Duluth lawyer who died in 1948. A former member of the governor's citizens council on aging, she was prominent in setting up programs for the aged in Duluth during the past 10 years. She organized Golden Age clubs in Duluth, as well as the first Senior Citizens' club in Duluth and Minnesota.

She served two years on the Duluth Welfare Council's Plus 65 Committee. She pioneered in establishment of the Jewish social service program and the Council of Jewish Women in Duluth and on the Iron Range. A member of the Duluth Jewish Federation and Community Council, she retired as executive director of the organization in 1956 after serving in the post seven years.

Mrs. Davis had served as chairman of fund-raisers for the Jewish Home for the Aged of the Northwest in St. Paul. A long-time member and leader in Duluth's Temple Emanuel, she had served as secretary for the temple's executive committee. She also was the author of a "History of Temple Emanuel."

She was the author of a book, "Fun with Yiddish," and a lecturer on Yiddish.

Mrs. Davis was named Duluth's 1965 Woman of the Year. Some of her recent activities include membership on the boards of the Minnesota Community Relations Council, and the Human Rights Committee. She was a member of Friends of the United Nations, Lawyers' Wives, the American Civil Liberties Union, the American Legion Auxiliary, the St. Louis County Historical Society, the Duluth-Superior Chapter of B'nai B'rith Women, the American Jewish Historical Association and the American Association of University Women.

She was a past president of the Council of Jewish Women, the League of Women Voters, the Maternal Health Center, and Sisterhood of Temple Emanuel.

Mrs. Davis was a graduate in social services of the University of Minnesota.
