A resident of Minneapolis more than 45 years, Mr. Nathanson was for many years president of the Clear and Tobacco Dealers' association, which he helped organize in 1912. He served on the civil service commission from October, 1918, to February, 1921, and was president the first two years. He was a member of Plymouth lodge, A. F. & A. M., the Scottish Rite lodge and the Shrine.

Surviving him are his father, B. L. Nathanson; a daughter, Mrs. Margaret Stone; six brothers, Isaac, Chas. Benjamin and Morris Nathanson of Minneapolis, and Nathan and Henry Nathanson of Toronto, Canada, and a sister, Mrs. Samuel Epstein of Minneapolis.
