

# ADOPTED SON IS HEIR FOR HEROIC WORK IN BATTLE

## Practically All of Martha A. League Estate Bequeathed to James S. Ward in Will.

---

"As a reward for the heroic work he is now carrying on in the army of the United States and in gratitude for many years of friendship," practically all of the estate of Martha A. League is bequeathed to her adopted son, James S. Ward, through provision of Mrs. League's will filed in probate court yesterday.

To the daughter of the deceased \$50 is left, the remainder of the \$1,225 estate going to the adopted son in the service. Petition for probate of the will was made in probate court yesterday by L. R. Gillpatrick. Mrs. League died at Biwabik Jan. 12, 1919. The will further provides that should Ward die without issue the entire estate shall be inherited by the daughter, Myrtle A. Morrow.

### Asks Administration.

Ida Polinsky petitioned for the administration of the estate of her husband, Louis Polinsky, who died Sept. 4, 1918, leaving real estate valued at \$3,200 and personal property worth \$125. The widow, three daughters and four sons are named as heirs. Sam Sander is named as administrator of the estate.

The estate of Louis Cohen, consisting of \$4,500 in real estate and \$525 in personal property, was brought into probate court yesterday by the widow, Fannie Cohen. Louis Cohen died April 26, 1916. The widow, five daughters and two sons are heirs. Eva Cohen is mentioned as a suitable administratrix.
