JACK ZUCKERMAN Obituary

ZUCKERMAN--Jack, 88 years. The Council of School Supervisors and Administrators mourns the passing of one of its founders and former president. Jack, a veteran of World War II, was a devoted educator who began his career as a teacher in the NYC public school system in 1948. Deeply grounded in the ideals and beliefs of the labor movement since childhood, he turned his attention to organizing school supervisors in 1959, giving them a unified voice. With several of his brothers and sisters in the labor movement, he succeeded in getting a charter from the AFL-CIO to form a national union which today is AFSA (American Federation of School Administrators). Jack was the Vice President of CSA when Governor Hugh Carey was persuaded to recognize it as a union shop and he stood beside the Governor when legislation was signed making that a fact. After retirement, Jack became AFSA and CSA's official historian and remained until his

death the keeper of the flame that illuminates our 50-year history as a union. We salute ×
Jack and extend our heartfelt sympathy to Estelle, his beloved wife of 62 years, and their
cherished children Lois and Marc Zuckerman and granddaughters Nora and Hannah.
